CONSTRUCTION UPDATE!

The 2012-2013 school year brings the largest enrollment ever for Lubavitch on the Palisades School, with almost 300 students. This year we have added a Third Grade, an 18 Month Program and Chai Care, a before/ and after school program that begins as early as 7:30 a.m. and goes until 6:00 p.m. To accommodate our growing elementary school and new programs, we are expanding our building to add 8 new classrooms and another multi-purpose room. This past week the exterior brick work was completed as well as the installation of air ducts and air conditioning units. We can't wait to see the progress over the next week!
